Dear Parents,

This is an explanation of the way in which we set targets and report on progress in Years 7, 8 and 9. Importantly, our system is based on one set of grades throughout Years 7-11 – GCSE grades. Our hope is that this will make things that much easier for students, parents and teachers to monitor progress at Wallingford School.




Figure 1: The new GCSE 9-1 grades, with the 'Old Style' A*-G grades for comparison

Minimum Expected GCSE Grades

All students in KS3 will now be issued with three 'Minimum Expected GSCE Grades'; one grade for English, another for Maths and a third for all other subjects. These grades should act as a guide to what students have the potential to achieve by the end of Yr11 across their various subjects.

How are these grades calculated?

The grades are primarily based on the results each student achieved at the end of KS2. They should be achievable, but aspirational. More precisely, for each student, they should reflect the achievement of the top 20% of similar students (KS2 scores, gender, age) nationally.

For those students where the calculated minimum expected grade is below a Grade 4, we will try to offer extra support to help increase rates of progress.

Target Zones

The Minimum Expected GCSE Grades relate to the End of Year 11.

To help assess progress towards these grades, we have also created yearly '**Target Zones'**. These zones will be shown on the first page of each Progress Report. Being within the 'Green' section, for the current year, would mean the student is 'on target' to achieve the **Minimum Expected GSCE Grades**.

The example below shows a Year 8 student's Target Zones, based on GCSE grades of 5/6.




Figure 3: An example set of 'Target Zones' for a Year 8 student

End of Year Predictions

Three times a year, students will be provided with an End of Year Prediction for each subject. These grade indicates our judgement of what the student could achieve by the end of the current year. Each prediction will be colour coded orange, green or blue depending on whether this prediction is 'below', 'within' or 'above' the target zone.

Predictions with a '+' symbol indicate a level of performance that is very close to the grade above, including significant aspects of work that are already at the higher grade.

EL, or 'Entry Level' is just below the GCSE 1-9 scale.




Figure 5: This shows how the whole grade and '+' predictions are positioned on the 9-1 scale

Accessing documents on the school VLE

Notes regarding predictions and target zones

• The old GCSE letter grades are no longer in use. However, since so many of us are familiar with A*-G grades, I have provided the following table, which provides a rough link between the new and outgoing grade sets.

- Our predictions are accurate at the time they are published; they may well change during the course of the year to reflect ongoing assessment.
- Predictions that are coloured orange indicate progress that is slightly below the suggested 'Target Zone'. This will be relatively common and shouldn't necessarily be a cause for concern; it should be used as an opportunity to reflect on whether any improvements can be made in those subjects.
- The yearly target zones are linear, e.g. suggest that students should make similar amount of progress each year. In reality, this won't always be the case.
- PE predictions are based solely on practical skills. This does not necessarily reflect the likely achievement in GCSE PE, as this course also involves a significant theory (written) component.
- In Y8 and Y9 students study two languages. In Year 8, a student's End of Year Prediction in the second language is likely to be lower than that for their first language as it will be the first year of study in the subject.
