

Expectations

1:1 Ratio	One hour of homework per lesson
Study Periods	Used for homework and extension work
Deadlines	Must be met. If not student must stay at the end of the day to complete.
Organisation	Keep organising folders, notes etc. Keep using Satchel One.
PLCs	Must be at the front of folders.
Opportunities	Involvement in extra & super curricular activities is encouraged.
Attendance	Aim for 100% attendance!
Communication	Encourage email, face to face chats, honesty. Use emails, newsletters, Satchel.



Dress Code

- In lessons, no outdoor clothing should be worn, e.g. hats, coats, gloves or scarves. Headwear should not be worn indoors (unless for religious or medical reasons). This includes hoods.
- Writing or logos on clothes should not be offensive.
- Tops should be worn at all times and must not be strapless.
- Tops should not have a low cut neckline so that the chest area is covered, nor should they have wide armholes that expose the torso.
- Tops should be long enough to cover stomach and bottoms should be high enough to cover underwear.
- No midriffs, no vests.
- All bottoms should be at least in line with your hands when standing upright.
- There are footwear rules in certain lessons due to health and safety issues. Generally speaking comfortable flat footwear is advised but sliders, crocs and flip flops are too casual.
- Lanyards should be worn at all times. Air pods/earphones/headphones should not.



Extended Project Qualification EPQ (AQA)

- On a subject of the student's choice can be on ANYTHING!
- Student researches and come up with a question to answer
- A supervisor guides and teaches skills such as footnoting (Weds P6)
- Students produce a long essay or artefact, and a log reflecting on the process (2-3 hours a week)
- Students present their work in March. All finished by April. Results in August.
- Worth UCAS Points(Half an A Level) and can result in reduced grade offers from university
