CHEMISTRY CONFERENCE AT TRINITY COLLEGE

The Department of Chemistry is hosting its first Christmas Chemistry Conference for Year 12-13 students – A Quantum Christmas Robin – on **12th December from 15:45-16:45 at Trinity College.**

Small migratory songbirds are extraordinary navigators: weighing less than 30 grams, they fly thousands of kilometres, alone and at night, ultimately with centimetre precision. To do this they use the sun and the stars, their sense of smell and physical landmarks but they can also perceive the direction of the Earth's magnetic field – an internal compass.

In this lecture, Professor Peter Hore FRS will discuss the theory that the birds' magnetic compass relies on a quantum mechanism in their eyes that is much more sensitive than previously thought possible. This work could have major implications for conservation, navigation and how we think about the robins and other small songbirds we see in our gardens.
