# Year 12 Assembly – Getting ready for Term 6

This morning students were given their exam timetables and an assembly about how to approach revision and the exams. Mr Harpin has put the powerpoint on Satchel.

They were also reminded of the dress code as we (hopefully) move into warmer weather next term:

- No uniform doesn't mean no dress code.
- This is a place of work and a school with students from 11-16 who wear a uniform.
- We choose not to have a strict dress code or ask 6<sup>th</sup> formers to wear business dress and
- we are happy for students to show their individuality in what they wear.
- We believe that behaviour and attitude are different depending on what you wear and if your clothes are too casual, your approach to your work may also be too casual. This is why we have a dress code.
- Our dress code is written in your student agreement.
- There is no uniform in the Sixth Form. The guideline is that what you wear should be appropriate for school. We may draw the line at extremes of fashion or at clothing considered more appropriate in a night club or at the beach, for example. In lessons, no outdoor clothing should be worn, e.g. hats, coats, gloves or scarves.
- What is meant by more appropriate at a nightclub or a beach?

SCHOOL

- Headwear should not be worn indoors (unless for religious or medical reasons). This includes hoods.
- Writing or logos on clothes should not be offensive.
- Tops should be worn at all times and must not be strapless.
- Tops should not have a low cut neckline so that the chest area is covered, nor should
  they have wide armholes that expose the torso.
- Tops should be long enough to cover stomach and bottoms should be high enough to
   cover underwear.
- All bottoms should be at least in line with your hands when standing upright.
- There are footwear rules in certain lessons due to health and safety issues. Generally speaking comfortable flat footwear is advised but sliders and flip flops are too casual.
- Lanyards should be worn at all times. Air pods/earphones/headphones should not.
