Oxfordshire Young People's Mental Health Forum

The forum is a safe spaced co-produced by young people for young people. The topics and projects will come from young people and are supported by Oxford Discovery College and Oxfordshire Mind. We will ask the young people, what is important to you and how do you want to share that answer. In Berkshire we have been supporting a similar forum for several years and during that time we have co-produced short films, training programmes, posters, designed conferences and spoken on webinars.

How do we attend?

Online via a Teams link.

How long?

One hour, we schedule the forums on different days and different times, although always in the morning so that if a safeguarding event occurred it could be addressed before the young person left school premises.

What is the format?

We discuss different topics and projects as suggested by the Young People

Safeguarding

The forum is a safe space, but we do have rules as created by the young people. This isn't a space to share deeply personal information, but to discuss ideas and opinions in a supportive safe space.
